I hope you are all keeping well and feel your connection with our school even though we still have a lot of restrictions in place. Our students and teachers are happy at school and are engaging in lots of learning and fun here at Fruitvale. Welcome back to those teachers, staff and students that were required to isolate at Phase 2 of Omicron. My apologies for not getting a newsletter out last week, but it was a very busy time, however, I feel we have got through the worst of it, in terms of how schools are required to respond to cases. Here are some updates from the precious two weeks:

Omicron

- Move from Phase 2 to Phase 3. As detailed to you in earlier emails, we will no longer be sending class groups home. Only students, teachers and staff who are household contacts or who test positive will be required to stay home for 10 days
- If your child has any covid symptoms, such as; a runny nose, fever, headaches or cough, please keep them home until they test negative. Keep your child home if anyone in your home has Covid.
- If your child tests positive let us know. This is the information we need from you: Name and class, last
 day they were at school, Date test was done and the type of test. If your child becomes a household
 contact let us know.
- Teachers will be extra vigilant in noticing students with symptoms, parents will be rung to collect their child.
- Thank you parents for supporting your child to wear a mask (for those that can), washing hands frequently etc. Thank you whanau for the sacrifices families are making to keep themselves safe.
- We warmly welcome everyone back, it is great for your child's well-being to be back at school.

Support available to whānau who are isolating (from Shirley White)

 Vision West has a Covid Care team with support and food parcels available for Whanau who are having to isolate at home. Their contact details are as follows: covidcare@visionwest.org.nz

If you are needing this support, email with your details - Name, number of people in the home and that you would like support with food as you are isolating at home because of Covid. They will get back in contact with you.

If you have someone from outside of your household who can support you in picking up a food parcel, Vision West has a Pataka Kai for emergency food parcels open 12 until 2, Tuesday to Friday at 97 Glendale Road, Glen Eden. They need the name of the person who the parcel is for, their phone details, address, and the number of people in the home.

If you are not isolating but are needing support with food, you can go to the Pataka Kai for an emergency food parcel at the times shown and address as above.
